I. The Prayers of the Saints (V. 1-5)

- A. God <u>hears</u> the prayers of His people.
 - 1. They are <u>sacred</u> to Him.
 - 2. They are <u>used</u> by Him.
- B. God <u>responds</u> to the prayers of His people.
 - 1. Not always in our way.
 - 2. Not always in our time.

II. The Response of God (V. 6-13)

- A. God can take away <u>anything</u> He has given.
- B. What people gain from rejecting God does not compare to what they will <u>lose</u>.

Group Discussion Questions

- 1. Read Revelation 8:1-13.
- 2. Who opens the seventh seal, according to verse 1? What does that tell you about Jesus' role in the end times?
- 3. What kind of prayers from Christians can only be answered on judgment day (use Revelation 6:10 for help)? If some of our prayers cannot be answered right away, why should we pray them today?
- 4. What does the angel lighting on fire the prayers of the saints and throwing them to the earth (V. 3-5) say about the role of prayer in the coming judgment?
- 5. How is the earth itself affected by people's disobedience to God, according to verses 6-13? What kind of warning do you think that should give us today?
- 6. Have you ever risked losing something you always thought you would have because of your disobedience to God? Why? How has that shaped your relationship with God?
- 7. Pray for our church to offer pleasing prayers to the Lord and not grow weary in asking. Come to the church prayer meeting this Wednesday from 6:00-6:30 pm in the Worship Center lobby.
