- 2. What does it mean that **missions exist because worship doesn't** (John Piper)? How does that statement challenge our understanding of evangelism?
- 3. How can we ensure that we are not just **hearing the Great Commission**, but actively **participating in it?**

## **Section 2: What is Disciple Making?**

- 4. In Matthew 28:19-20, Jesus commands us to **make disciples**, **not just converts**. What's the difference?
- 5. Who in your life has been an example of discipleship for you? How can you be that example for someone else?
- 6. If discipleship is meant to be **relational and intentional**, what are some practical ways you can disciple someone in your church, home, or workplace?

## Section 3: What Did Jesus Command?

- 7. Jesus commanded His disciples to **teach others to obey** all that He commanded (Matthew 28:20). What are some of Jesus' commands that are hardest for you to obey?
- 8. **1 Timothy 4:12** challenges believers to set an example in **speech**, **conduct**, **love**, **faith**, **and purity**. Which of these areas do you feel most challenged in?
- 9. In what ways does obedience to Jesus' commands lead to deeper worship and a stronger witness to the world?

## **Final Personal Reflection:**

- 10. Where is God calling you to **step out in obedience** to make disciples?
- 11. What barriers—fear, busyness, doubt—hold you back from fully embracing the mission of God? How can your home group pray for you to overcome these?
- 12. If the goal of discipleship is to **honor God and make Him known**, what is one step you can take this week to **honor God more openly** in your daily life?
