- 4. How can God make such a decisive statement about man's sin in verse 5 when men still do good things occasionally?
 - a. What does this verse tell us about the depravity of man without God?
- 5. How can God regret something (V. 6) if He never makes mistakes?
 - a. Is it possible for us to make a good decision that still leads to more sorrow?
- b. What does God's grief over the depravity of man tell you about the sadness of sin?
- 6. What does God's decision in verse 7 tell you about the severity of sin in the eyes of God?
 - a. What does this verse tell us would happen to us without the cross of Jesus Christ?
